

## 2nd Green Aruba Energy Conference opens today

ORANJESTAD -- This is an exciting weekend for Aruba, when 2 spectacularly important events coincide and interwine; the "Bishita Real" or Royal Visit of Her Royal Majesty, Queen Beatrix of Holland with her son, Prince of Orange, heir to the throne, and his wife, HRH Princess Maxima.

Today at 9:30, the opening sessions of the Green Aruba Energy Conference will also begin. The inaugural conference last year brought former Vice-President Al Gore to Aruba as Keynote Speaker; this year HRH Prince of Orange will end the three-day event on Saturday, after which the formal signing of the agreement between TNO Netherlands Organization for Applied Scientific Research) and Aruba for the establishment of the first renewable energy research and learning center in the region will close the conference.

Green Aruba 2011 is an opportunity for any and all who are interested in the welfare of not only Aruba, but the entire planet, to learn about the latest technology in harnessing renewable and "clean" energy sources from innovators in sun, wind, geo-thermal and hydro-energy. Presenters have traveled from Europe and the U.S.; lectures and the display booths are in English.

Opening session today will feature addresses of welcome by island officials: Prime Minister Mike Eman and Minister of Finance, Telecommunications, Utilities & Energy, Mike de Meza, who will outline their vision for an Aruba and Caribbean region independent from the vicissitudes of a volatile oil industry. Jan Willem Kelder, a member of the TNO Board of Management, will also address the gathering.

The morning sessions will be dedicated to the topic "Green Energy for Small Island Countries" featuring Ulric Trotz, Science Adviser from Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre and Aruba's Minister of Economic Affairs, Social Affairs and Culture. Michelle Hooyboer-Winklaar. After the lunch break, the topic will continue with guest speakers Kevin De Cuba from the ECPA Initiative Manager Energy and Sustainable Development Specialist at OAS, Duzan Doepel of the Hogeschool of Rotterdam and O.J. Boekhoudt, Director of WEB Aruba, the island's energy producer and water plant, followed by a panel discus-

## Department for Labor Progress working diligently on clearing accumulated overdue petitions
