Therefore, de Mezas believes that Aruba as a small island must prepare herself before it is too late. Aruba does not have fossil fuels. But, what we do have is the sun and wind, and we have these in abundance and we are surrounded by water. All three of these are sources of sustainable energy.

As a tourism island, sustainable energy is extremely important to us. For this reason, said De Meza, Aruba is focusing heavily on green energy. Much has already been done and there is a whole lot more to be done.
